



Time is running out

for Canada's Great Bear Rainforest.

Stretching along Canada's west coast in the province of British Columbia, the Great Bear Rainforest is the largest intact coastal temperate rainforest left in the world and is home to the rare white 'Spirit' bear, grizzly bears, soaring bald eagles, rivers of wild salmon and ancient red cedars.

Yet this globally unique rainforest still remains unprotected and under threat from destructive logging.

Four years ago, international pressure to safeguard this magnificent rainforest set an unprecedented coalition of industry, loggers, local communities and environmental organisations on a path to finding a solution. Today, that solution exists- all have agreed to protect close to two million hectares of ancient forest and implement sustainable forest management throughout the Great Bear Rainforest.

However, one step remains. To ensure that this solution is realised, the Government of British Columbia must fulfil its commitment to protect the Great Bear Rainforest and act by the end of September 2005. Otherwise this historic opportunity may be lost.
